
I am seeking some help for 2 projects:

ABSENCES

Thank you for your consistent communication of your child's absences. With parents calling, emailing or messaging via Message You we have very few unexplained absences on our system. Next term, we will have a new procedure in place to help as a final reminder.



Thank you for joining us today at our last big assembly and open day for 2019. I know you will have enjoyed looking at your child's work and evidence of their ongoing learning. As staff we have been looking at our school data collection and are very pleased to be able to let you know the programs we put in place in 2018 are showing rewards. While it takes some time for successes to show large gains, we can show that:

- Our Sounds Write data is showing strong growth in Year 3 NAPLAN this is due to a strong
 foundation in the PP and the program being run in Year 1 and 2 for the past 3 years. This
 improvement will be reflected further in future data in other years as the program's
 implementation continues to be consolidated and extended.
- All students have progressed at least 2 levels this year in PM Benchmarks, apart from those who
 are at level 29 or 30 but just had a focus on comprehension, which reflects the success of
 Springboards into Comprehension. We have value added by backtracking to ensure all strategies
 are embedded and are now able to extend these students
- Students have shown good progress from their initial to their follow up narrative writing piece. I look forward to celebrating their ongoing development in their Term 4 assessment which we will share with you so you can see the improvement from the Brightpath report sent home in Term 1.

This data is the evidenced based data we use to track our students' progress. It provides a strong base for judgements on a students' achievement and progress over time. NAPLAN has its value for us in assisting to identify areas for future growth but all schools use NAPLAN data in combination with their school data. For a school our size, with small cohorts, this data is easily skewed by both cohorts and individual student achievement.

This is why we assess ourselves against like schools. Like schools are those that have similar contexts to our own. We have maintained or gained a percentage higher than like schools with students in the top 4 bands in Year 3 Reading, Writing, Spelling, Numeracy and Grammar and Punctuation, Year 5 Reading, Grammar and Punctuation and Spelling. We are just below in Numeracy (3%) and are working on our Writing focus.

We will always aim to achieve or be better than the national average but the reality is we need to target things in small chunks and over time. For us over the past two years, we have been focussed on our reading and spelling with writing added as a focus in 2019. Next year we will move into a focus on numeracy as is in our School Plan.

When looking at a child's progress in any test situation, a child's progress is the sum of ALL of the previous years of teaching. We are a team at Walkaway, always reflecting together to celebrate our successes and focusing on areas of improvement together.

Thanks again for joining us today.

As always, I encourage you to come and see me should you have any concerns. I hope you have a happy and safe holiday and I look forward to seeing everyone back in Term 4.


- All library books need to be returned as soon as possible.




On 25th October, the PP—Year 6 students will be attending an World of Maths incursion.

- Don't forget your light clothes and a hat for the *Colour Run* this Friday.




















CHILDREN'S FIRST AID HOLIDAY PROGRAM




